Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection.

Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

Australian Early Development Census

completed every three years, assessing children's development before they start full-time school. AEDC data helps understand community needs and plan support services. Participation is voluntary but vital for accurate results. Parents don't need to provide new information, and individual child data isn't disclosed. Keeping safe Child Protection Curriculum

Our Term 2 Keeping safe Child Protection focus is 'Relationships'. Throughout the term students will engage in age-appropriate lessons through the Health Curriculum to develop an understanding of this topic in particular trust and our trust networks. Students are asked to identify a network of people and support services they can trust and seek help from. The communication letter was sent home in February. The Importance of Routines

I recently read an article discussing the benefits of establishing routines for both children and parents. It prompted me to evaluate the routines in my own household, ensuring that both my daughter and I have structured schedules.

Research shows that consistent, repetitive routines can have a calming effect and alleviate stress and anxiety. This is because they provide a sense of control over daily activities, leading to a feeling of overall life control. Additionally, achieving tasks within a routine can bring a sense of accomplishment, further reducing stress. While establishing routines may pose challenges initially, the long-term benefits for everyone involved make it worthwhile.

TIPS ON HOW TO GET INTO A ROUTINE

- 1. Decide what needs to be in your routine. Do you want to get more exercise or more alone time?
- 2. Set small goals. Break each large goal into smaller goals work your way up to something you want to accomplish.
- 3. Layout a plan add in what you want to accomplish with your routine. Want to get more exercise? Start a new hobby?
- 4. Be consistent with time time is important for your routine, keep track of the time so you know what is coming up next.
- 5. Make it fun! Have fun with your routine don't add in something you're not going to enjoy.
- 6. Track your progress are you sticking to the routine? If so, then well done and keep it up. If not, then look for where you can improve.
- 7. Reward yourself.

Catholic Education Week is being celebrated in Catholic schools throughout South Australia from May 13-19, 2024.




3B News



This Term 3B have started looking at Indigenous Art. We have looked at a number of different artists through videos and artworks and

used the medium they were most known for using to recreate in a lesson-based activity. Last week we looked at an Artist called Nongirrna Marawili who is an artist in Yirrkala, in northeast Arnhem Land in the Northern Territory. Our activity was to create a stencil that represented the fundaments of print making, pattern, repetition, and colour.

We started by watching a video of our chosen artist, who showed us how they started making their artworks. We then folded a paper in half and drew our stencil on this in pencil. We cut our design out and then using water colours we painted inside the stencil pattern. We are looking forward to looking at more artists and the different ways we can use materials in our artwork.




