The students were involved in the Mass by taking part in the Gospel and Offertory procession and reading the Prayers of the Faithful. The students had learnt 2 new songs about the Sacred Heart of Jesus for this Mass and sang beautifully. Fr Long Hai also commented on what a wonderful job they did of joining in with all the responses.

During Reconciliation Week, all classes took part in a Reconciliation Liturgy. Some classes did this individually, while others gathered together in year levels or teams. A big thank you to Heather Docherty for planning such a beautiful Liturgy reminding us that no matter what, the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will - and must - continue. The theme for Reconciliation week this year was 'Now More Than Ever'.

On Friday 21st June we will gather together as a whole school community, along with the parishioners, to celebrate a very special Mass,

the Feast of St Aloysius Gonzaga, the namesake of our Church community here at Richmond. Saint Aloysius is the patron saint of young people who led a very religious life. When he was just 9 years old, he told his parents that he wanted to live a religious life, and at the age of 17 he joined the Jesuit order.

Year 2 Religious Education lessons

A few weeks ago, I visited the Year 2 classes to hear all about their learning in Religious Education. The students had been learning about prayer, and some of the prayers we say as part of our Catholic faith, including the Our Father and the Hail Mary. I was very impressed with all the knowledge and new learning they were able to share with me. We spent some time together making colorful Rosary keychains consisting of one decade of the Rosary. Once we had completed making the keychains, we joined together in praying the Rosary. The students were then able to take their Rosary keychains home to share with their families. Thank you to the Year 2 teachers and students for inviting me to be a part of this wonderful learning.

Sacramental Preparation

Over the last 2 Tuesday evenings, several Tenison Woods students, along with students from St John Bosco and the parish met to begin preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation which they will celebrate later in the year. Thank you to Fr Long Hai and the Sacramental team for working together with the school to support these students as they continue their Sacramental journey.

Developing Numeracy skills at home

activities, such as solving problems and managing money. Mathematics encompasses recognizing numbers, shapes, patterns, sizes, time, and measurements. Integrating math into daily experiences is simple and enjoyable, as math is all around us – in the playground, at the shops, and at home.

Children benefit from numerous opportunities to engage in activities like making, counting, drawing, and discussing numbers. This section aims to assist you in fostering these skills in the children you care for. While the math your child encounters at their early childhood setting, kindergarten, or school may differ from what you learned, you can still offer valuable support. Help your child understand the relevance of numbers and counting by demonstrating their presence in everyday life.

Talking about maths for young children:

It's essential for children to develop specific language skills related to mathematics. Activities like visiting the playground or helping at home offer rich and meaningful contexts to foster these skills. While it may take time for your child to effectively use these terms and language, exposure to mathematical talk strongly supports future learning.

Here are some activities to develop mathematical language for children:

- Use specific terms when asking for items. For instance, ask your child to get the 'one litre' milk bottle from the fridge or the 'one kilo' bag of flour from the cupboard.
- When cooking, discuss the different measurements used, such as teaspoons, millilitres, litres, and cups. Talk about concepts like empty and full.
- During walks and playtime, describe your child's movements as they climb 'over' the fence, slide 'between' the poles, and swing 'under' the monkey bars. This helps them understand language related to spatial awareness.
- Sorting activities help your child grasp concepts such as 'same' and 'different'. Use recycling as an opportunity to sort items for disposal, such as paper, plastic, food waste, and general waste.

Engaging your child with measurement:

Understanding measurement and scale is essential to your child's grasp of maths. Here are some tips and activities:

- Use a wall measuring chart to track the height of family members.
- Discuss the sizes of objects around your child, helping them determine which are bigger or smaller, taller or shorter.
- Cut a piece of string and use it as a measuring tool around the house. Have your child measure objects to find out which are longer or shorter than the string and identify anything that matches its length.
- Explore various ways of measuring, such as using a cup, jug, teaspoon, icy pole sticks, footprints, or hand lengths.
- Help your child build a tower of blocks taller than a favourite toy and then count the total blocks to measure the height.
- Estimate and measure distances by seeing who can jump the furthest, stand on one foot the longest, or guess how many buttons can fill a jar.
- Investigate the capacity of different containers by pouring and filling. Estimate first, then check to see which holds more or less.
- Observe changes in the weather and time of day. Create a rain gauge from an old bottle to measure and monitor rainfall.
