If they say they are not OK, you can follow the conversation steps to show them they’re supported and help them find strategies to better manage the load. If they are OK, that person will know you’re someone who cares enough to ask.”

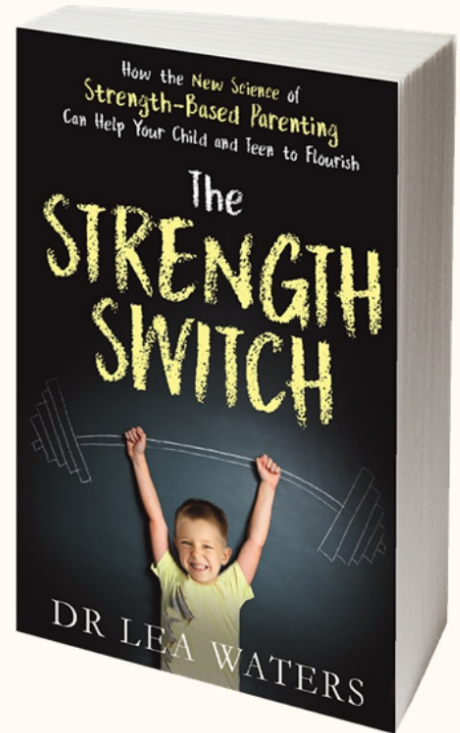

Students took part in these celebrations in a variety of ways, including being part of the entrance and offertory processions, and reading the Prayers of the Faithful. All students are to be commended on their reverent engagement, and the way in which they joined in with the responses and songs. A sentiment that was echoed by a number of parishioners who were at the Feast of the Assumption Mass.

We are now in the season of Spring and the **Season of Creation**. The **Season of Creation** is an annual Christian celebration inviting us to pray and respond together to the cry of Creation. It unites our Christian family around the world to listen and care for our common home.

The Season of Creation began on September 1st, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and concludes on October 4th, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. This year's theme is '**To Hope and Act with Creation**'.

During this Season of Creation, we are called to work together for a future of hope and action to make our world a better place. What could this action look like?

Some simple ideas are:

- Go on a beach walk and spend some time praying and giving thanks for the gift of creation that God has given us

Developing Literacy

As adults, we may not consider the process of learning how to read until we begin teaching our own children at home. Learning to read is a difficult process that necessitates the explicit teaching of a wide range of skills. This includes Oral language, Phonological awareness, Phonics, Vocabulary, Fluency and Comprehension.

Activities to support your child's development at home

- Make reading enjoyable and engaging.
- Children learn to read by observing, imitating, and interacting with others.
- Allow your child to pick and re-read books that capture their interest.

- Discuss the book before starting, including the title and possible storylines.
- Talk about the illustrations and how they contribute to the narrative.
- While reading, ask your child questions like, "What do you think will happen next?" and "Why do you think that?"
- After finishing, discuss the story and ask questions such as, "Which part did you like the most?" and "What did you find exciting, funny, or sad?"
- Take turns reading favourite stories with siblings or friends.
- Incorporate a range of reading materials, including newspapers, magazines, posters, street signs, recipes, and shopping lists.

Enjoying reading, language, and words at home

- Select books that include rhymes or riddles.
- Discuss rhyming words, explaining that words like cat, hat, sat, and bat rhyme because their endings sound alike.
- Engage with rhyming words by playing rhyming games and creating playful rhyming sentences, such as "Have you ever seen a snail deliver the mail?"

At Tension Woods, we implement a comprehensive, whole-school approach to literacy instruction. Our method incorporates a multi-sensory, synthetic, sequential phonics system, with all components being explicitly taught. We draw from various programs to ensure the best teaching and learning is achieved for our students.

Our school is always here to support your child's learning journey. Together, we can foster a strong literacy foundation for your child's future success.

ReceptionM - Mid Year 2024



Welcome back to Term 4 all the Mid-year reception students at Tenison Woods Catholic School. As they step into this exciting period of learning and exploration, they're eager to dive into a variety of engaging activities and subjects. The learners have done a great job in adjusting to the school routine as well as their classroom and school community.

In Literacy, last term we focused on Phonological Awareness Skills: Blending and Segmenting, Oral language: speaking in a sentence / sentence construction. We are also preparing for our letter formation by practicing the pre-writing patterns. This term, we will engage in Identifying the Initial Sound Awareness, Oral language: Speaking in a sentence description consisting of what? Colour? Parts? Along with pre-writing patterns.

In Numeracy, last term, we have been practicing writing numbers from 0-5 using the appropriate cue words and working on different ways to substitute the number. This term, the learners will gain understanding of numbers 6-10 and learn to recognise, copy and continue repeating patterns.

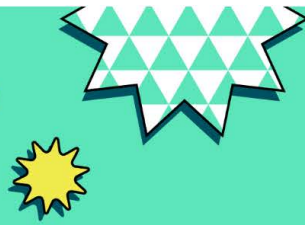
In Religion, we learnt that Jesus Christ was the son of God who lived on Earth, and Jesus loved children. We learnt that The Sign of the Cross is a special prayer to God and the action symbolizes your belief in the Holy Trinity—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. 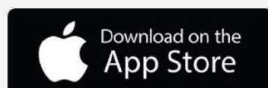

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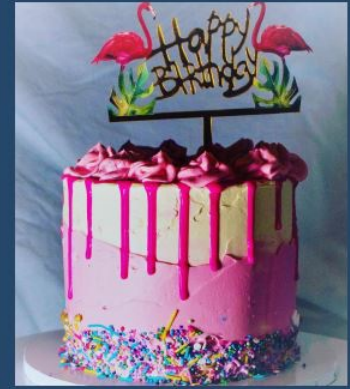
